REPORT OF THE ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING

The Annual Business Meeting of the SCGS was held in Sumter November 6, with President Eugene Sneary presiding. Reports of the Officers, Committees, and Chapters were heard. Since our meeting last year in Greenville, two additional chapters have joined Society - Greenwood and Pendleton District. All the Chapter Presidents or Representatives made interesting reports of their chapter's activities during the year.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO STATE

Since many of us did not hear the President's Report to 6 November 1976 State Annual South Carolina Genealogy Society Meeting at Sumter, we are reprinting the Greenville Chapter's report:

The Greenville Chapter has increased its membership from 23 in 1975 to a total of 81 making an increase in membership of 58 for the year 1976. Our programs were presented by members of our Chapter, who shared many interesting techniques and stories associated with genealogy.

The Greenville Chapter co-sponsored with the Greenville County Library three Genealogy classes in April, May, and October 1976. We also held our own WORKSHOP in April on Southeastern Research with Mary B. Warren, Lecturer.

The Greenville Chapter has completed the first phase of the State project of marking cemeteries on maps of Greenville, Spartanburg, Union, Cherokee, Lancaster, and Chester Counties. We have also published in April in addition to the 28 charts published in November 1975, 114 seven generation lineage charts and have recently completed publication of another 191 seven generation lineage charts, making a grand total of 327 charts with 37 pages of 4 column full name index.

We are looking forward to 1977 with continued work on the State Project and a few of our own, such as surveying cemeteries and publishing more lineage charts in what shall be known as Volume II. We thank all of you for making our project a success. Your enthusiasm has meant a great deal to us, making our task a pleasant adventure. Your charts will be a useful tool in genealogy.
