NOVEMBER MEETING-The Greenville Chapter, SCGS, met on November 6, 1997, Thomas F. Parker Auditorium, Greenville County Library, at seven p.m. with twenty members and two visitors present. The president welcomed the group. The minutes of the October meeting were accepted as printed in the November newsletter. It was reported that the nominating committee is working on a slate of officers for 1998. A suggestion was made that some additional officers (such as corresponding secretary and news editor) be secured so that the work could be more evenly divided among those who attend. Frank Spearman was named chairman and it is hoped that more information with nominees will be ready for the December meeting.

The vice president as well as program chairman, Betty Monahan, introduced a fellow worker Penelope Cansler who mentioned social censuses known as supplemental schedules were taken 1850, 1860, 1870 and 1880. She focused on the supplemental schedule of 1880 entitled "The Defective, Dependent, and Delinquent Schedule" (a social statistics schedule) for the 1880 census. This is the "Forgotten Census" which was the subject of her talk. She used the overhead to show what information this census revealed. Other supplemental schules were the agricultural, industry, manufacturing and mortality schedules taken during the censuses of 1850 - 1880. She replied to questions from the audience. Her program was well received. Thank you, Penae. (Penae is a member of the Greenville Chapter.)

The meeting was adjourned. Refreshments provided by Ruth Stewart and Lenore Putman were enjoyed by the group.
