HAVE YOU BEEN PUZZLED ABOUT CERTAIN ARCHAIC TERMS REFERRING TO DATES, especially when reading old newspaper accounts of past events? Your newsletter editor has "borrowed" the following item from GRAB, the Journal of the Old 96 District Chapter SCGS: "There are some archaic terms referring to dates that will make you stop and blink if you run across them in your genealogical research. For example: Monday instant—when used, usually means "today." The 10th instant—means the 10th of the present month. The 20th ultimo means the 20th of the last month. Monday last—the most recent Monday. Tuesday next—the nearest Tuesday to follow. December last—the most recent December. While the terms "next" and "last" are usually written out, the term "ultimo" is sometimes written "Ult." and "instant" is "Inst." It is important to note the date on the document of newspaper being studied as that is the key to the dates to which the writer refers."
