"Colonial Migration and Western Expansion"

Sally Anderson has a degree in history and is an experienced lecturer at DAR and Historical Society meetings. She has been a Family History Consultant in the LDS Church for 20 years. She is going to speak to us on migratory patterns, why people went west, how they obtained the land (including Revolutionary and Civil War veterans), and other related topics.
