An eighth generation Greenvillian, Jack Grady has been active in civic, social, and fraternal affairs of city, county, and state. He has been a member of the Appalachian Council of Governments Historic Preservation Committee, the Greenville County Historic Preservation Commission, and the Community Development Task Force's Historic Preservation Committee. He presently serves as Verger at Christ Church. He was involved in restoring the Huguenot Mill Office Building and began the restoration of the Hampton-Pinckney Historic District. Mr. Grady is a student of local history and frequently speaks on Greenville's early churches, graveyards, and settlers.
