Steve Richardson, a Simpsonville native and Furman graduate, is the coordinator of Reference Services at James B. Duke Library at Furman University. He is currently researching and writing a history of Simpsonville which will be published as a book, a taped oral history, and a digital collection of multimedia. Publication is scheduled for Summer 2001.
