THE DARK CORNER

Dean Stuart Campbell has not only lived and learned much of Southern Appalachian history and heritage, but he clings to a deep, abiding love for mountains and mountain people like those of his native Dark Corner. The author of *Eyes to the Hills—a Photographic Odyssey of the Dark Corner of South Carolina*, he was among the first to see the “other side” of that reportedly sinister area. He was an active participant in *Documenting the Oral Tradition of the Dark Corner* which preserved over 30 hours of authentic recordings from residents. He presently serves on the executive council of Upcountry Friends, and on the board of directors for Historic Greenville Foundation. His love for the area shows in his presentation of color slides and photographs.

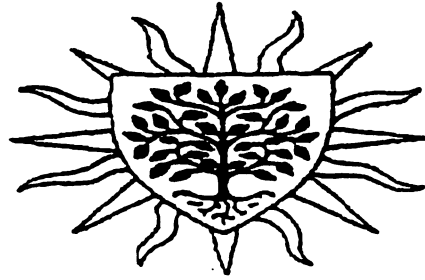
