LAND GRANTS IN NORTH CAROLINA (AN OVERVIEW)

Our own Journal editor, Bruce Pruitt, has compiled 75 books, most of which are about land records. While the majority concern North Carolina, he has also compiled books on deeds in Spartanburg and Greenville. He is currently abstracting more deeds for the Greenville Chapter Journal. He was born in Mississippi but raised in Rutherford and Gaston Counties, NC. He attended Presbyterian College and Clemson University, receiving a doctorate in physics. He joined the Greenville Chapter in 1975, and is a past president of S.C.G.S.. He is also a member of the National Genealogical Society and the North Carolina Genealogical Society. He has received two "Best Book" awards from N.C.G.S.
