Genealogy and the World Wide Web: A Commentary and Personal Insight on Using the Internet for Genealogical Research.

Mel Odom was born and raised in Greenville County, and has been a genealogy researcher for many years with a keen interest in connecting many of the old families from upper Greenville County. He is coordinator of the Greenville County GenWeb and compiler of the online database Some Related Families in Greenville County, South Carolina. JOHN COOPER FAMILY CEMETERY

Lowry Wilson found an old cemetery on Thursday, 7 Dec. 2000. Eight readable markers and one with initials were standing. There is evidence that many more old graves are there, but are marked by a depression in the ground with a few having field stones. It is located at Rocky Acre Tr. near end of Boling Rd. off Staunton Bridge Road, Greenville County, SC. Latitute: N 34 degrees 47.63 minutes Longitude: W 082 degrees 27.48 minutes.
