"SOCIETY OF THE CINCINNATI"

Scott Johnson will speak on the "Society of the Cincinnati." The Society was organized at the conclusion of the American Revolution, on May 13, 1783, by the officers of the Continental Army. The first President of the Society was General George Washington. Scott graduated from Clemson University in 1981 and is at present teaching at Mauldin High School, Mauldin, SC. Subjects taught include World Geography (Regular and College Preparatory), World History (Regular, College Preparatory, and Honors), Psychology, Sociology, United States History (Honors) and English Literature. He has been interested in Genealogy for a number of years.
