## "USING BAPTIST RECORDS FOR GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH"

Glen Clayton has been at Furman University since 1972. For most of those years, he has been Special Collections Librarian and Archivist. The Baptist Historical Collection is a significant part of Special Collections. It is the archives for the SC Baptist Convention. Glenn is a graduate of Wake Forest University, Southern Baptist Theological Seminary with at degree in Church History, and University of South Carolina (Master of Librarianship). He will talk about how to use Baptist records for your research and will cover the resources that they have at Furman in Special Collections that are of value for genealogy.
