DNA PROJECT

The Barton Historical Society in Lyman has invited us to participate with them as a joint-venture sponsor in a Brigham Young University DNA sample BYU has traveled all over the world collection. collecting blood samples for their research project. While not of immediate benefit to genealogists, it has potential to greatly benefit future generations. Those interested will need to provide a four-generation biological pedigree chart, approximately 1 tbsp. of blood drawn by a licensed phlebotomist, and a consent form. The results will be archived in a confidential file system at BYU in Utah. The results will not be available to other agencies and will be accessible to BYU researchers only. Many rules insuring privacy of your medical files are in place. You have control over their use. The time and location for our local participation has not yet been decided. We need 200 volunteers. As it will probably take place this summer before our next newsletter is published in September, it will be publicized in the local newspapers, on the chapter website, at the Greenville County Library, and on the BYU website. You can obtain more information on the project and download necessary forms from BYU's website at http://molecular-genealogy.byu.edu/participate.htm. Those outside the Greenville area can check this site to see if the project is being conducted in their area.
