This is a fantastic tool for 1880 searches. It is on 56 CDs and indexes everybody on the census and gives most of the information found on the microfilm of the census. If you do not know the state your people were in, you can search the National Index. You can also search the neighbors when you find an entry. There are transcription errors but with a little imagination you can usually overcome these.
