Minutes of 6 September 2001 meeting: The meeting was called to order by President Evelyn Williams. A welcome was extended to members and visitors and the meeting then turned over to Terald Knorr to introduce the speakers, Fred Manning and George Stevens, from North Carolina. They presented a program on the Battle of Kings Mountain on October 1780. Fred Manning laid out the historical background up to the period immediately prior to the battle. George Stevens related the details of events during the month of September 1780 when the "Over the Mountain Men" began to assemble. The program was very enlightening and a visit to the battlefield on the NC/SC state line is recommended. There is a web site at OVTA.org (Overmountain Victory Trails Assn.) with a genealogist on the site to help locate possible ancestors. The business meeting was held following the program, including the treasurer's report and a report on the State Workshop in July. The meeting was adjourned for refreshments provided by Rose Kubler and Mary Drawdy.
