TIPS FOR NEW GENEALOGISTS:

Do not insist that your ancestors' names have to be spelled the way you spell them or close ancestors spelled them Spelling was just not that important in past years. People were not as educated – yes, some of your folks may have been illiterate!. You don't know who spelled the name for the census taker or the record clerk. It could have been the grandmother from Ireland, the 8 year old child, the next door neighbor, or nobody. Perhaps the family disagreed. Five brothers came from Ireland. Two spelled their name McCollum, three spelled it McCullum. Of course, this wasn't always the case. It was also spelled McCallam –om –um; McCollam –om –um; McCollam –om –um; with 'n' on the end instead of 'm'; even McColley.

A child named Neil McCollum arrived in New York by ship in 1847. He was Neal McCallum in 1850 Brooklyn census; Cornelius McCallen in 1860. That's the last he could be found in Brooklyn. While searching some known cousins of this person who migrated from Brooklyn to Madison, Lake County, SD, a reearcher was looking at the 1900 census. She scanned a page back from the cousins to see if there were any more of them. She saw a Neil McCollin. McCollin is usually not related to McCollum, but it's possible. The age was about right - 62, he was born in NY, and he emigrated in 1847 — the exact year. Hopefully he survived until death records in SD began in 1904. A helpful death records person agreed to search and found the death certificate in 1907. It didn't have much information, but the exact date enabled another helpful person in the Madison Library to find an obituary, which mentioned those original cousins were relatives. It was the right person after twenty plus years of searching.

Membership Committee: Shall receive all applications for membership; shall actively engage in developing Chapter membership by seeking out potential members; shall keep a roster of members in good standing.
