### President's Message

Thanks to Kate Boyd, Virginia Pierce, and Laura Blair of the National Digital Newspaper program who educated us on a free database research tool known as Chronicling America: Historic American News-papers. This program digitizes newspapers to a free online database. There are thirty-two (32) states currently enrolled with the scanning of over 100,000 pages. The criteria for choosing newspapers are their research value, geographical coverage, and temporal coverage (1836-1922).

"SCDNP makes historic newspapers in South Carolina freely accessible and full-text searchable through a partnership with the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) and the Library of Congress (LC).

In 2009, the University of South Carolina Libraries received a <u>National Digital Newspaper Program (NDNP)</u> Brant from NEH to digitize South Carolina newspapers from 1860 to 1922. During that time, SCDNP digitized 103,352 newspaper images. Users can access these newspapers from <u>Chronicling America: Historic American Newspapers</u> A, hosted by LC.

Delve into the rich content of historical South Carolina newspapers in this <u>SCDNP LibGuide</u> A. Here you will find topics guides with interesting historical news articles, images, and headlines that we have already found for you, as well as Important Dates, Suggested Search Terms and Strategies. Also, view a cool timeline featuring our favorite examples of historical S.C. newspaper articles and find helpful tips on searching Chronicling America."



Andrea read the Nominating Committee's nominations for officers to be voted on at the next meeting:


